Eligibility

The School Liaison Program will support:

- Active duty military, National Guard and Reserve military personnel, DoD civilians, and their families living on or off the military installation within the Service-approved catchment area.
- God Star spouses of military members who died from a combat related incident.
- Those acting in loco parentis for eligible dependent PreK-12 military children.

Naples Student Transportation Office (STO)

- Students must be registered with STO in order to be eligible to ride the bus. Registration for school does not automatically register students for transportation.
- •Make sure to speak with the STO regarding specific bus stops (listing available) and note areas not serviced.
- •The middle section of Constellation Road (street in front of schools) will be blocked during loading and unloading of students Monday-Friday (0730-0815) and Monday-Wednesday and Friday (1410-1445). Thursday early release will be 1245-1330.
- Student drop-off occurs at either end of Constellation Road: in front of Child Development Center (CDC) as well as behind Navy Lodging Villas/in front of staff parking lot (fenced area).
- Students/families MUST use crosswalks when crossing the street.

Free and Reduced Meal Program

Student Meal Account

- Student ID number will be provided by the school after the completion of registration.
- Complete required account set-up form and provide Student ID number to the NEX
- Add money to account via NEX Customer Service Desk or https://www.mypaymentsplus.com

Please note that school lunches are free for all DoDEA students during SY20-21.

Paperwork for reduced prices and meal accounts are not needed.



Naples Navy Exchange (NEX) and DoDEA Schools Food Allergen Awareness

Does your Child have food allergies? Please follow the process below to inform the DoDEA School and Navy Exchange Student Meal Program (SMP).

Obtain DoDEA Form 6 SHSM H-3-6 from your child's school. Complete it and return it to the school nurse. The school nurse will provide the information to the Navy Exchange Student Meal Program.

The Student Meal Program offers two entrée options daily (non-COVID). Please review the current menu to determine if your child may need meal substitutions.

Does your child need meal substitutions?

Bring the signed physician's statement, DoDEA Form 5 SHSM H-3-6, identifying the food allergies to the school nurse, once on file with the school nurse contact NEX Customer Service at 081-813-5372 to schedule an appointment with a School Meal Program representative to discuss appropriate substitutions for your child. Once completed the SMP will provide a substitute menu to you and the SMP Kitchen Manager.

Food Allergies and Special Diet Requests: The USDA's non-discrimination regulation (7 CFR 15b) as well as the regulations governing the NSLP and SBP, requires that substitutions to the regular meal be made for children who are unable to eat school meals because of their disabilities, when that need is certified by a licensed physician. Under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990, a 'person with a disability' means any person who has physical or mental impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities, has a record of such impairment, or is regarded as having such impairment.

International Schools

NSA Naples and the U.S. Navy do not endorse or accredit private schools. No financial support is available through NDSP to attend schools other than the DoDEA schools on Support Site. There are numerous school options that have been referred by community members who have chosen them for their children and have been visited by the School Liaison Officer.

Before enrolling your child in an off-base school, please research and visit the school, discuss your child's needs and educational history with school administrators, discuss curriculum and potential impact on the next school location, speak with the School Liaison Officer, and speak to other families who have children enrolled in the school.



Homeschool

- •If you are thinking of homeschooling your child, there are many choices. You can elect to work with one complete curriculum or you can blend a variety of curricula to meet your child's needs.
- •Please connect with the School Liaison Officer to discuss methods/styles, curriculum, hybrid models, online options, groups, public charters, private tuition based, and more!
- •A host nation, state, commonwealth, possession, or territory where a DoD sponsor is stationed may impose legal requirements on home-schooling practices. DoDEA encourages DoD sponsors who wish to home-school their dependents to communicate their desire to their commanders to determine if there are any command policies or other rules ensuring that home-schooling practices meet nation, state, commonwealth, possession, or territory requirements. At this time, there are not any Italian or NSA Naples requirements to notify Italian entities or DoDEA Naples schools that you wish to homeschool.
- •DoDEA Directive-Type Memorandum (DTM) 16-E-001, dated December 19, 2016, clarifies DoDEA services that are available to eligible Department of Defense (DoD) dependent home-school students.

School-based Military & Family Life Counselors (MFLC)

Who they are: All counselors must have a master's or doctorate degree in a mental health-related field, such as social work, psychology, marriage and family therapy or counseling.

Who they serve: Open to Active duty, National Guard and reserve members and their immediate family members. All staff and support personnel, regardless of affiliation, can receive solution focused non-medical counseling. Civilians and family members may participate in group settings.

What: Program provides confidential, non-medical, short-term, counseling services face-to-face. Telehealth available during COVID.

When and Where: School support is provided during the academic year.

Why: To support and augment. To assist with circumstances occurring across the military life cycle.

MFLCs provide support to individuals, couples, families and groups for a range of issues including, but not limited to:

- Deployment Stress
- Reintegration
- Relocation Adjustment
- Separation
- Anger Management
- Conflict Resolution
- Parenting
- Parent-Child Communication
- Relationship and Family Issues
- Coping Skills
- Homesickness
- Grief and Loss
