

Greek Temples of Paestum



Be amazed by Paestum, a Greco-Roman site located south of Naples. This site contains the stunning remains of three ancient Greek temples, Poseidon, Hera and Ceres, which were believed to be dedicated to the city's namesake. Founded as a Greek colony in the sixth century BC, Paestum was originally known as Poseidonia, named for the Greek god, Poseidon. Learn of its decline and abandonment and its rediscovery in the 18th century. View its impressive defensive walls, the Roman Forum, ancient tombs, and the basic remains of a Roman amphitheater of which only half is visible.
